ABOUT THE MOUNT SINAI WOMAN TO WOMAN PROGRAM

The goal of **Woman to Woman** is to provide one-on-one emotional support and education to women in treatment for gynecologic cancers.

Woman to Woman is a network of volunteers at The Mount Sinai Hospital who have survived gynecological cancer, are inspired to share their experiences, and have been specially trained to offer one-on-one support.

Woman to Woman volunteers are survivors of gynecologic cancer. They are professionally trained to help women reach their full potential for recovery. Complementing our team of healthcare professionals our volunteers offer:

- **Patient-to-patient support**
- **Empathic understanding**
- **Practical information and assistance**
- **Navigation of the healthcare system**
- **Stress reduction**
- **Guidance on available resources**

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: *Who is eligible for the Woman to Woman program?*

A: Any woman who has been diagnosed with gynecologic cancer and is receiving treatment at The Mount Sinai Hospital may participate in this program.

Q: *How can I access the program?*

A: You can contact us yourself, or access us through your doctor, the gynecologic oncology nursing staff, or the program social worker. The social worker can be reached at **212-241-3793**.

Q: *Who are the volunteers?*

A: The *Woman to Woman* volunteers are survivors of gynecologic cancer and are at least one year past treatment.

Q: *Does Woman to Woman have a support program for partners?*

A: Yes. At time of diagnosis, partners are given an information guide specifically written for them and are offered emotional support from our social workers. One-on-one support from peers is also available.
