New Regulatory Requirement for Mount Sinai Health System Employees Working Onsite

July 10, 2020, Friday

Beginning Monday, July 13, all Mount Sinai Health System employees working onsite are required to complete a self-assessment and attest that they are free of COVID-19 symptoms at the beginning of each shift. **This is a regulatory requirement and all staff must comply.**

The self-assessment includes the following COVID-19 symptoms:

- Fever (> 100° Fahrenheit)
- Chills
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- New onset persistent cough
- Nasal congestion and runny nose not associated with allergies
- Sore throat
- New loss of taste or smell
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Fatigue (new or not explained by a pre-existing condition)
- Headaches (new or not explained by a pre-existing condition)
- Generalized muscle and body aches (new or not explained by a preexisting condition)

Staff who have symptoms and screen positive must:

- Immediately contact a supervisor to alert them that you will not be reporting to work due to a positive screen

Leadership at each Health System site will advise as to the local protocol for completing the symptom assessment and attestation.

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
