COVID-19 Health System Updates

July 21, 2021, Wednesday

I hope all of you saw the note yesterday from Dr. Davis and Dr. Charney about the importance of vaccination against COVID-19. It is critical that each of us—and especially health care workers—protect ourselves and our patients against this deadly disease with a vaccine.

Scott Gottlieb, MD, the former head of the Food and Drug Administration and a Mount Sinai Health System trustee, put it starkly over the weekend on the CBS show *Face the Nation*. He said the Delta variant is so contagious that it is going to infect most people who are not already protected against COVID-19, and added, "For most people who get this Delta variant, it's going to be the most serious virus that they get in their lifetime in terms of the risk of putting them in the hospital."

I highly recommend that you watch the segment or read the transcript. And please share this with members of your teams who don't regularly read email.

As of this morning, we had 31 COVID-19-positive inpatients across the system, 9 of whom were in critical care. The New York State seven-day average test positivity rates stood yesterday at 1.3 percent for New York City, 1.7 percent for Long Island, and 1.0 percent for the mid-Hudson region.

Mount Sinai is teaming up again with Accenture and Pfizer to host a panel discussion next week, "Navigating the Effects of the COVID-19 Pandemic: Back to School, Back to Community." And if you haven't been vaccinated yet, please do so now. The rising test positivity rates and case numbers indicate there's no time to lose. Please keep yourself and your patients safe. Thank you again for all you do for Mount Sinai and our patients.
