




Goal Attainment

Intensity of Therapy


On average, our patients receive 3.2 hours of therapy per day, including Physical and Occupational Therapy, Speech Language Pathology and Neuropsychology. Supplemental activities are offered daily by our Therapeutic Recreational Specialists.

Functional Improvement



The Functional Independence Measure (FIM) is the gold standard for measuring function in the rehabilitation industry. Our patients make significant gains in function and independence during their inpatient stay and outpatient program.

Discharge



The majority of our patients are discharged back to the community following inpatient rehabilitation. Some patients (18.7%) require further rehabilitation in a sub-acute setting prior to returning home. A small percentage (12.8%) require transfer to the acute hospital for further medical management.
